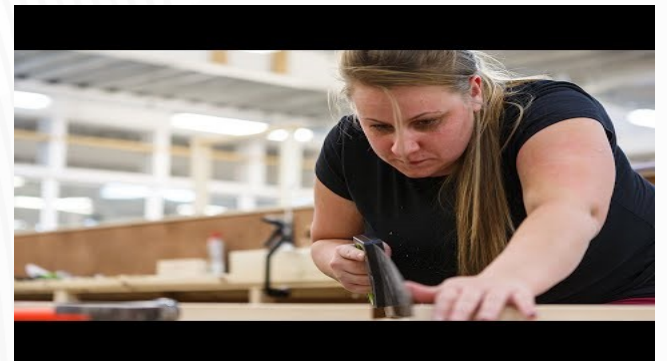

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The next generation – T Levels

T Levels – a new alternative to A-levels

- Training for a specific occupation 'on the job', whilst continuing with an academic education
- Endorsed by business, min 45 days of industry placement to learn what a real career is like
- Progression to a skilled job, higher apprenticeship or university
- Two years of full-time study and equivalent to three A Levels (UCAS equivalent points)
- 80% classroom/20% on work placement
- Underpinned by maths, English and digital skills

- Health and Science: Supporting the Adult Nursing route
- Digital Support Services: Digital Infrastructure

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Entry Levels & Progression

BTECs

- Level 1: three GCSEs at grade 2 or above
- Level 2: three GCSEs at grade 3 or above, will continue to study maths and/or English at GCSE to achieve grade 4
- Level 2+: three GCSEs at grade 4 maths, English grade 3 and one other grade 3 for Plumbing, Electrical Installation, Motor Vehicle and Engineering
- Level 3: four or five GCSEs at grade 4 or above including maths and English

T Levels

- A minimum of five GCSEs at grade 9 - 4 including maths and English

Funding – free Up to **age 19**

Lots of students start at Level 2 (1 year course) and progress to Level 3 and above - study BTECs to Degree level

A level 3 BTEC/T Level is equal to three A-level grade UCAS points – lots of students to go university!
