
### **Apprenticeships**

For information on how to find an apprenticeship you can either search via local college apprenticeship vacancy pages, individual company vacancy pages, via the national <u>Find an Apprenticeship</u> website or via Unifrog.

A good starting point is via the national apprenticeship search engine - <u>Find an apprenticeship - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u> On this website you can search by Job Title or Employer and narrow it down by putting in your location and how far you are willing to travel.


### Find an apprenticeship

Search and apply for an apprenticeship in England



While vacancies might not come up until Spring 2023 it good idea to have a look at what type of apprenticeships are being advertised so that you can have a think about which ones you might be interested in applying for. If you are interested in having an apprenticeship, I would recommend you do the following ASAP.

- 1) If you do not have a personal email account, you will need to create one. Think about what name you are using, for example does gameboy99@..... really give the right first impression to an employer?
- 2) Please register on Find an Apprenticeship and sign up to have email / text 'alerts' when apprenticeships that you are interested are advertised.
- 3) You will need a CV to apply for any apprenticeship a good starting point is to visit Unifrog and use their CV / Resume drafting tool Sign In Unifrog



### **Understanding Post-16 Qualifications**

There are 4 main choices on how to study Post-16: T'levels, A'levels, BTECs and Apprenticeships and to make it even more complicated within BTECs and Apprenticeships there are different levels of qualifications ranging from Level 1 to Level 3. GCSE estimated grades will give Y11 students some guidance on which of the course might be the best one(s) for them to consider and I would always recommend students have an 'aspirational choice' and a 'safe choice' (similar to how university choices are done).

**T'levels** – Gloucestershire's Cirencester College has been at the heart of these pioneering qualifications. They are a 2 year technical study programmes designed in partnership with employers that combine class room training and a 45+ day industry placement. Cirencester Collage and Gloucestershire College both have a selection of T-levels that include subjects as diversity as Floristry and Garden Design to Adult Nursing and Events and Venue Technicians. These courses have been devised in close contact with employers to ensure that students have the practical skills to ensure they are 'work ready'.

**A'levels** – are Level 3 qualifications, are studied across 2 years and students normally study 3 A'levels plus an additional qualification like EPQ or completing DofE Gold etc. Some university courses will expect students to have studied certain subjects at A'level and as a rule of thumb it would be beneficial to have a 6+ at GCSE in order to study a subject at A'level.

BTECs – are practical-based, vocational qualifications. They can be studied at a college or some schools and they provide the opportunity to gain hand-on experience in a field or subject. BTEC Level 1 & 2 are equivalent to GCSEs and Level 3 is equivalent to A'levels. Students can progress from a L1 through to a L3, normally over a 3 year period.

In addition to the above, colleges like Cirencester college offer Access courses (meaning students may spend 3 years rather than 2 at the college) e.g. Access to A'levels, is a foundation year getting students ready to take A'levels and the T-level Transition Programme (see below for more information)

### **One-to-One Careers Appointments**



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

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### **Launch of Unifrog**

Last September saw the launch of Unifrog at Seven Vale School. To support our commitment to provide students with outstanding careers guidance and tailored support when choosing their next step after school, we will now be using Unifrog (an award-winning, online careers platform) as our main careers information tool. The Unifrog platform is designed to support learners in making the most informed decisions about their futures and has a range of tools that are suitable for all year groups. Each student (Years 7-11) has their own personal account that provides a wide range of information related to their interests and aspirations. We have also set up a parent login so that you can use Unifrog as if you were a student yourself, allowing you to support your child with their career's choices throughout their time at Severn Vale. ### **Work Experience & Careers Fairs**

While Severn Vale School's Y10 Work experience takes place in the 1st week of July (3rd - 7th July 2023) work experience is not limited to this one week in July nor is it limited to just Y10s. I would encourage students from Y10 and Y11 to also have a placement in the summer holidays as well as taking advantage of the weekend 'insight into industry' days that are offered by local companies and the GROWS network. Please keep an eye out on the below for current work experience / insight into industry days that are advertised throughout the year.

### Kohler Mira – Engineering and Business Work Experience Placements

We are operating a NEW procedure for Work Experience this academic year and will be taking applications until 18<sup>th</sup> November 2022 for work experience until July of 2023. This is to help us manage the number of requests we see come through a little better and hopefully also motivate your students to apply for a work placement sooner rather than later. Students can still request their preferred week in line with any dedicated weeks that you have outlined for them, but will need to have applied by the deadline.

### The application form is on the SVS website - work experience page

We request that all applicants submit the Work Experience Application Form which I have attached to this email (and which is available on our website), alongside a short Covering Letter outlining why they wish to do their work experience at Kohler Mira and their interest in the area they have applied for. This may include projects they have worked on and/or or hobbies/interests inside or outside of school that support their application. Not only is this good practice for the working world that we want to encourage amongst your students, but it helps us to better understand the motivations and interests of those applying so we can look to tailor the experience as best we can. **NHS Work Experience 2<sup>nd</sup> October DEADLINE to apply –** This is an intestive VIRTUAL work experience programme that is accepted by UCAS as medical work experience.

The NHS Allied Healthcare Work Experience successfully invited 12,000 students to participate in its programme last academic year, making it the largest programme for students who are interested in the following careers:

- Nursing Midwifery Paramedicine Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy Dietetics Radiography Prosthetics and Orthotics
- Speech and Language Therapy Pharmacy

Students considering a career in the Allied Health Professions (AHP) are encouraged to secure their place on the programme as soon as possible. This will allow them to complete several sessions of work experience before the UCAS deadline for NHS Health Careers in January.

Once they've registered, students will be emailed links to their virtual work experience portals.

Students are awarded a Work Experience Certificate for every session they complete. Those who complete the full 5 month programme will be awarded a Highly Commended Reference from the Presidents of Allied Healthcare Mentor. These are fantastic additions to their CVs and UCAS applications!

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. They will gain a unique insight into how patients interact with a variety of healthcare professionals and what it's like to work in an NHS multidisciplinary team.

Attendees will have the opportunity to interact with healthcare professionals throughout each day. This will empower students to make an informed career decision and demonstrate their commitment to healthcare in their UCAS applications.

Students can register individually at any time throughout the 5-month programme using the link below. We recommend booking early to gain as much out of this programme as possible. Places are £10 a session to cover administrative and technological costs.

### Post-16 Timeline

I have had some requests from parents & students for a suggested timeline around Post-16 applications for current Year 10s – please find a guide below for Current Year 10s:-

July -September 2022 - There are lots of school Sixth Forms and Colleges in Gloucestershire and so using the summer holidays to whittle them down to a shortlist may well be a sensible first step in deciding where to go after Severn Vale School. Why not begin researching via Unifrog or 6th Form / Colleges own websites. Aim to compile a short-list of Post-16 choices by the end of September, having checked first that your GCSE estimated grades are on target to meet the course requirements. Following this you need to apply to attend a selection of open-days / open evenings (Top tip - If applicable - remember to research what student bursaries are available for you to apply for e.g. travel bursaries).

**Sept - November 2022 -** Attend at least two College or Sixth Form open-days (these may be inperson or virtual open-days depending on Covid-19). Most colleges only have a couple of open days a year, while some Sixth Forms only have one a year and so you do need to get organised early. Please note you will find many of the popular colleges open-days get full early. (**Top tip** - Severn Vale School will be issuing all students with a list of open-days at the start of September but some are already being advertised (see Colleges & Sixth Form pages of Newsletter for more information)).

**FLD 24th November 2022** - Severn Vale School will be taking all of Year 11 off timetable for the day to allow them to visit a Post-16 destination of their choice. Transport will be provided by Severn Vale School, however as students are only able to visit one venue, it is important that students choose carefully. As well as getting to see the facilities, an open day is a great opportunity to find out more about the different courses on offer from those who teach and study it - current students and academic staff. (**Top tip** - For many students choosing a college or sixth form is a bit like buying a house - and so you may well find that you end up going with your gut feeling and choosing the college or sixth form that feels like it could be your home for the next 2 years. Remember what is right for your friends might not be right for you).

**November – December 2022 - January 2023 -** Submit applications to College / Sixth Forms (**Top tip** - you can submit multiple applications and can also accept courses at more than one provider, and you do not need to decide on where you are going until GCSE Results Day in August 2023)

**December 2022** – Complete, via Unifrog, your Post-16 destination form, remembering to include a Plan A and a Plan B – this information will allow us to be able to review all of Year 11s applications and do a check on suitability and ensure all of Year 11 have the balance right between being aspirational and attainable.

**January - February 2023** - If appropriate - apply to local grammar schools - please see their website for the application window (normally only a few weeks).

**February - May 2023** - If appropriate - apply for apprenticeships via either Unifrog or Find and Apprenticeship website <a href="Find an apprenticeship">Find an apprenticeship (findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk)</a>

August 2023 - GCSE results day - decide on which Post-16 place you are going to enrol at.
